Materials for Thank Goodness It's Finished

This is an embroidery finishing course. NO EMBROIDERY IS REQUIRED. If desired a student may stitch the included designs or finish existing embroideries.

The supplies needed will vary depending on whether a student uses unembroidered fabrics, finishes her own embroideries or chooses to stitch the class samples shown in the course photograph. The following information is a general overview of the materials that were used to embroider and construct the class samples. Students are strongly urged to read the text information before purchasing any materials. They may already have appropriate items in their fabric and thread stashes.

Required to receive a certificate of completion: scissors tassel, drawstring bag, pincushion and <u>either</u> the fabric covered box <u>or</u> the totebag.

Students will need a ruler and or yardstick, straight pins, paper scissors and fabric scissors, and:
