Sam's studio work crosses dimensions: working in 2-D, 3-D and 4-D she is just as likely to create an immersive installation as she is to create a work that fits in your pocket. Sam's jewelry focuses on bead technique providing a forum where she is currently exploring contemporary geometric beadwork. During the past several years she has been honored to work with Kate McKinnon and team. This work has connected Sam to a network of thousands of beaders worldwide. Sam is a professor at the prestigious university for creative careers, the Savannah College of Art and Design. At SCAD she is honored to teach what very well may be the only University bead level courses that apply to a degree. Sam teaches bead classes in the Jewelry and Fibers Dept. and is always ready to share the amazing work her students create. About Contemporary Geometric Beadwork De-mythicized



Students will work through a variety of sample pieces to understand and explore some of the Contemporary Geometric Beading forms and techniques. In exploring forms students will look at simple triangles and learn how to use them as a tool to detonate / create negative space frames. Students will also explore warped squares and their relationship to the creation stars: 5 point and 6 point, and other possibilities. If time allows, students may have time to also explore wings and horns. This will lead us to the project work which will be to explore triangles, their relationship to tetrads, and, next to explore tetrads in pairs and the pairs relationship to kaleidocycles and to cycle bracelets. Students will be equipped to complete their projects as kaleidocycles, cycle bracelets or necklaces.
