November 2023 Stitch-a-long Project Grandma's House

Grandma's House is a quilt block embroidered in a 10 inch hoop.

- 1. The ground fabric is 12 inches wide and 6 inches high. Since the pueblo style house is in a desert climate, the fabric chosen resembles the ground. If your house is in a greener area, your ground fabric might be a shade of green.
- 2. Sky fabric (blue) is also 12 inches wide and 6 inches high. Sew the two fabrics together along the 12 inch side.
- 3. The pueblo house is a strip of tan fabric 7.5 inches wide and 4.5 inches high. Sew the house silhouette onto the quilt block folding the edges under using a running stitch of 3 strands of floss in a color of your choice. You may substitute the silhouette of any style house.
- 4. Sew 5 brown buttons along the top of the house representing wooden vigas.
- 5. Outline architectural details such as doors and windows using 2 strands of floss with backstitch. Fill in the door using long and short stitches with 2 strands of blue floss. Watch parts are couched onto the door representing a peep hole and door knob/knocker. Fill in reflective glass areas with satin stitch using 2 strands of floss in two shades of blue.
- 6. Embroider a chili ristra next to the door using 2 strands of red floss creating a bullion knot with 12-15 wraps for each individual chili creating 12 chilies. Use straight stitches to create the corn husk tie at top of the ristra.
- 7. Stitch a climbing rose bush on one side of the house using 2 strands green floss and stem stitch for the stems, daisy stitch for leaves and French knots for the roses in the color of your choice.
- 8. Use straight stitches of green to alternate blades of grass with brown beads to create a border along the front of the house.
- 9. Paint bicycle and car scrapbook embellishments and couch to the ground fabric.
- 10. Finally embroider wispy clouds in the sky with 2 strands of white floss using a split stitch.
