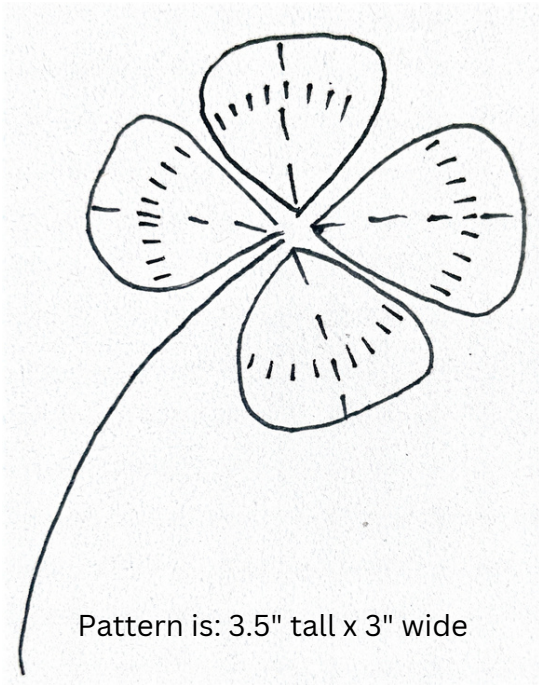
TOOLS & MATERIALS

- 2- 6" square of forest green fabric
- 4" bamboo hoop
- Embroidery needles
- DMC 6 strand embroidery thread
Light Green: 3348, Medium Green:3347
Mustard Gold: 728
- Silver Metallic Thread
- 10" Length of Ribbon
- Thread Scissors

GETTING STARTED

- Separate the two pieces of the hoop.
- Center your pattern within the non-hardware hoop and fit the outer ring around both the fabric & inner hoop. Tighten screw & fabric.
- Individually separate three strands from the bundle of six. Reassemble them to use as one strand.
- Thread one end of thread on needle. Tie a small knot at the other end.
- You are ready to stitch!

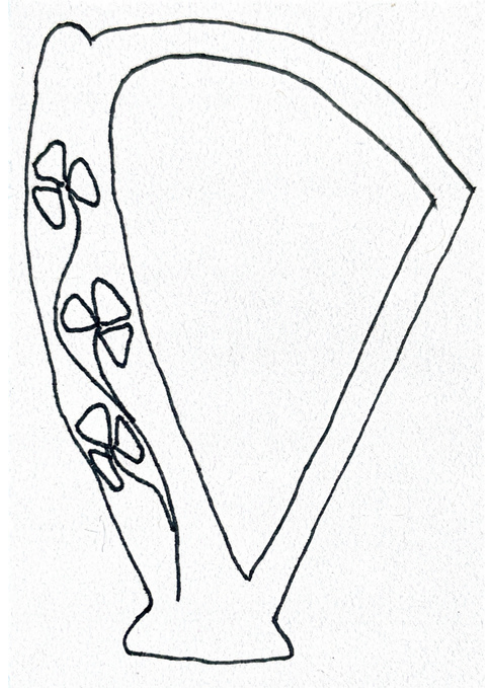
THE PATTERNS



Pattern is: 3.5" tall x 3" wide

Stitch the outline of the clover in medium green in a Stem Stitch. Straight & Running Stitches are within the leaves, worked in the light green thread. You may also Split Stitch the leaf outlines and fill with a shaded Long & Short Stitch.

In the mustard gold thread, stitch the outline of the harp in a Back Stitch or a Whipped Back Stitch. Using 1 strand of the light green thread, stitch the stems of the Shamrocks in a Stem Stitch. Next, Satin Stitch the leaves. The metallic thread will be used to create the harp's strings. Evenly space these as laid stitches, working back & forth. I spaced 8 strings in my example and I chose not to couch the threads so they appeared more like strings.



Pattern is: 3.5" tall x 2.5" wide
