Supplies needed for Moroccan Lanterns:

- Embroidery frame or hoop (10 inch minimum)
- Embroidery needle
- Scissors
- 1 piece dark fabric. As this is a counted pattern, you can choose any count. I chose 14 count which allowed the pattern to fit nicely inside a 10 inch embroidery hoop. If you use a dark-colored fabric (I used the DMC dark blue 5225), the lamps will look like they're shining in the night sky.
- Embroidery threads. Cotton or polyester work well. I used threads from the DMC Mouliné Étoile Floss, which adds a subtle sparkle.
  - Brown: DMC C433
  - Magenta: DMC C814
  - Yellow: DMC C725
  - Orange: DMC C740 and/or C666
- About 20 inches of metallic chain. This does not need to be jewelry grade but should be a brassy color to coordinate with the lantern color. This is sold by packet or spool in craft stores.
- Optional beads to add to the lamp corners.

The benefit of this design is that you can place the lanterns in any configuration. I would make sure, however, that the middle of each lantern has an uninterrupted straight line to the top edge of the piece. This is so that the chain that will be tacked on at the end won't need to be cut and pieced (as in the image above).
