Poinsettia Pin

Scratch that Christmas in July itch (a little early!) with this design. Using rick-rack stitch, a combination of peyote stitch and herringbone increases, popularized by the talented folks behind Contemporary Geometric Beadwork, build layer upon layer to create leaves, petals, and a center bloom.






Kit Contents:

Needles; Thread; Pinback; 10 colors of size 11 cylinder beads in red, green, and yellow; Size 11 seed beads and rondelles

Students will also need:

Beading mat; Chain nose pliers (optional but recommended); Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification





A Secret Garden

Kris Andrews

Come plant a secret garden with me. We will plant hand-dyed velvet grass on a field of brown silk dupioni, walled in with padded burden stitch. We will construct a stone well and ring it with chenille reeds. A path of leather, cording, and beads will meander across the garden. I will show you how to make flowers and shrubs of raised, padded, and turkey work stitches so you can plant the beds with vibrant colors.



Kit Contents:

Dark brown silk Dupioni fabric with well and wall patterns transferred; Cotton backing fabric; Hand-dyed green silk velvet; Variety of silk and chenille threads; Beads; Stones; Pearl purl thread; Kid leather; Wool felt; Bird charm; Needles



Students will also need:

A frame that can take tension all the way around a 6 ½" square design (a 12" square frame or a sufficiently large hoop work well); An additional 6"-7" hoop for practice stitches and detached elements; Laying tool; A 90° triangle or a small 3"-4" square, with ¼" markings; Scissors for cutting metal thread; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Exploring Drawn Thread

Jane Ellen Balzuweit

Explore drawn thread techniques including Ruskin Lace and Ukrainian Myreshka, plus various ways of twisting and weaving fabric threads. This piece is for basic beginners to the advanced intermediate stitcher as there are some choices of stitches for different levels of proficiency. A silk ribbon flower adds to the beauty of this piece. Students have a choice of working the piece on Congress Cloth or 24-count linen.



Class length: 2 days Technique: Drawn thread Proficiency: Basic/Intermediate Finished size: 5"x10" Kit fee: \$125

Students will also need:

Scissors; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Kit Contents:

Congress Cloth or 24-count linen (your choice), 11"x15" and doodle cloth, 7"x7"; 11"x15" and 7"x7" mini stretcher bars and tacks; DMC pearl cotton #8 and #12; Silk ribbon, 4mm and 7mm; Brazilian thread, Iris; #26, #24, and #22 tapestry needles; #8 crewel needle; #26 and #24 chenille needles; #3 straw needle; Instruction booklet with pictures



Scarlet Letters Sampler

Eileen Bennett

Twenty-five bands have been worked with 20 olde sampler stitches. These include: Long-Arm Cross, Two-sided Italian Cross, Belgian Cross (a reversible cross stitch), Four-Sided, Italian Hem, Knit Stitch, Marking Stitch, Partial Queens, Small Algerian Eyes, Small Rice, and Tent. Worked in rich shades of blues, greens, and a variety of red threads, the Scarlet Letter Sampler offers a lesson in 17th Century sampler making.



Course length: 2 days Technique: Counted thread Proficiency: Intermediate Finished size: 5.43" x 9" Kit fee: \$75

Kit Contents:

32-count Mocha colored linen; 9 skeins of DMC threads; #24 and #26 tapestry needles; 28-page instruction booklet which includes charting and stitch diagrams; Photo; Washing instructions; 2 pages of historical notes; Bibliography of sampler stitching

Students will also need:

4"-5" hoop or other holding device, if desired; Scissors; Pencil; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Lattice-scape

Kurdy Biggs

I love stained glass-inspired pieces that offer stitchers options – so when I saw the framework for this piece I was intrigued. Lattice-scape is composed of five different shapes that make up the 13 sections of the design. Each section is an individual design that may be used once or repeated – that decision is up to the stitcher. The center of Lattice-scape is a unique section with a trio of multi-tiered Jessicas, along with several Crescent variations. Other stitches include Overlapping Sprats Heads, Walnetos, and Diamond Plaited Rays, among others. Iridescent threads from Treenway, Rainbow Gallery, Accentuate, and Soie Perlee will be used along with beads and crystals to assemble a stunning casement window piece.



Course length: 2 days Technique: Canvas work Proficiency: Intermediate Finished size: 14"x7 ½" Kit fee: \$190

Students will also need:

12"x18" stretcher bars and tacks or staples to attach the canvas to the stretcher bars; Frame stand or weight; Laying tool; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification

Kit Contents:

12"x18" 18-count soft ivory canvas; Threads; Beads; Crystals; Needles; Instructions



Exploring Needle Lace Diane Clark

Relax into a new technique! Needle Lace has been used for centuries, including some current embroideries. In this class you will learn several Needle Lace stitches to create a reference notebook for your personal needlework library. Using DMC pearl cottons on 18-count linen and 25count Lugana, stitches covered include Brussels, Double Brussels, Corded Brussels, Pea, Needle Lace over padding, detached Needle Lace, Needle Lace on wire, and Whipped Treble Brussels.



Students will also need:

Embroidery scissors; Pen or pencil for notetaking; Highlighter; Needle threader (optional); Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification; 3-ring binder (not needed for class)



Kit Contents:

#20 and #22 tapestry needles; #22 chenille needle; #9 embroidery needle; DMC pearl cotton #5, #8, and #12; Sewing thread; 5 ½"x5 ½" 18-count white linen; 5 ½"x5 ½" muslin; 4" embroidery hoop



Geometric Fascination

Denise Harrington Pratt

In this fun two-day class students will learn to make paper covered boxes. They also will begin embroidering a beautiful box top, stitched in an interesting variety of counted thread stitches, creating an unusual and interesting textural design. Each kit is unique, with fabric and thread colors chosen to coordinate with specific wallpaper samples. A detailed demonstration for attaching the embroidered box top will wrap up this information-loaded class.

Course length: 2 days Technique: Counted thread & Box making Proficiency: Intermediate Kit fee: \$76

Kit Contents:

28-count linen; Waterlilies handdyed silk; Soie Cristale silk; Kreinik #4 very fine braid; Kreinik cord; Skein of DMC or Anchor floss for cording; Needles; Mounting component; Two box kits; Label; Instructions



Students will also need:

8" hoop; Paint brush, flat ¼" or similar (a watercolor brush works well); An old dishtowel for wiping water and glue from the boxes during construction; Craft scissors with sharp points for cutting paper, 7" or 8" works well; Aleene's Tacky Glue; A binder and sheet protectors are helpful for organizing pages; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Pirate's Parade

Judy Jeroy

Welcome to the Pirate's Parade where fanciful insects march along, searching for a place to bury their treasure. We will stitch beetles, an ant, a wasp, and a mantis using cotton and rayon threads on a background of luscious cream fabric. Stitches used will include satin, fly, chain, back, outline, and knots. This is a class destined to teach you a perfect satin stitch.



Course length: 2 days Technique: Surface embroidery Proficiency: All levels Finished size: 3 ½"x15" Kit fee: \$50

Kit Contents:

Fabric; Threads; Needles; Instruction booklet

Students will also need:

Two 22" stretcher bars and tacks; Two 10" stretcher bars and tacks; Table clamp; Scissors; A mini flatiron to smooth and straighten the threads is recommended (teacher will bring two to share); Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



The Flight of the Rufa Red Knot Canby Robertson

This 2 ½"H x 13"W landscape class will be fast paced, requiring a prior working knowledge of basic stitches such as stem, back, French knot, satin, straight, detached chain (lazy daisy), Pekinese, open chain, and seed stitch. We will concentrate on embroidering birds, with a focus on background, midground, and foreground landscape by using the texture of basic stitches to create desired effect. Discussion will include environmental concerns facing the Rufa Red Knot and Monarch butterfly populations.



Course length: 2 days Technique: Surface embroidery Proficiency: Intermediate/ Advanced Finished size: 2 ½"x13" Kit fee: \$140

Kit Contents:

Hand-painted linen ground fabric; Au ver à Soie threads: (Surfine, 100/3, and Soie d'Alger); Gloriana threads; Needles; Instructions with photos

Students will also need:

5" wooden hoop; 1 dozen long shank straight pins; Thin lead mechanical pencil; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Old Glory Pin

Kay Ackerman

This design name comes from its antique patriotic color palette. The hand-painted brass filigree with a center glass cabochon will be part of the materials for embroidering a pin using O-style beads such as Czech O beads and Toho Demi-Rounds. Students will learn more about combining beads and metal filigree including information on how to make their own focal components for bead embroidery.



Course length: 1 day Technique: Bead embroidery Proficiency: Basic Finished size: 3 ¼"x3 ¼" Kit fee: \$45

Kit Contents:

Needles; Thread; Pin back; Stiff felt; Backing material; Three colors of size 15 seed beads; One color of size 11 seed beads; Three colors of size 8 demiround seed beads; One color of size 11 demi-round seed beads; Three colors of Czech O beads; 3mm crystal sew-on rhinestones

Students will also need:

Beading mat; Chain nose pliers; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Gold Medallion Sampler

Kris Andrews

Come and dip a toe into the world of goldwork! My Gold Medallion Sampler provides an introduction to a variety of gold materials and techniques for the beginner, accented with silk. The piece is stitched on 28-count linen, and is 3" square, making a quick finish. Each section stands alone, so stitchers can move at a pace that is comfortable. The backstitched framework can be completed ahead of time, so class can really focus on different stitches.



Students will also need:

Course length: 1 day Technique: Goldwork Proficiency: Basic Finished size: 3"x3" Kit fee: \$35

Kit Contents:

28-count linen, 9"x9"; Silk threads; Imitation gold passing thread; Freshwater pearls; Gilt pearl purl; Gilt check purl; Gilt check thread; Gilt 1 ½" twist; Needles; Beeswax; Couching threads

A hoop large enough to hold a 3" square design; Scissors for cutting metal thread; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification

The Flower Show

Jane Ellen Balzuweit

This blue-ribbon piece is not only pretty but fun to stitch. You will learn tricks that make both techniques easy to stitch as you stitch four ribbon flowers and three Brazilian flowers and a basket. When the flowers are stitched, a white tulle is appliquéd to form vases.



Kit Contents:

10"x10" Moire, cream colored (if this is not available a similar fabric will be used); 7"x7" doodle cloth of the same fabric; Muslin backing fabric; Variety of Brazilian rayon threads;
Variety of silk ribbons in 4mm and 7mm widths; 12"x12" mini stretcher bars and tacks; 5" hoop; #24 and #26 chenille needles; #3 and #5 straw needles; Large darning needle; Instruction booklet with pictures

Students will also need:

Scissors; Thimble; Frame holder, weight, or clamp; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Strawberry Fair Sampler

Eileen Bennett

Our favorite summer fruit, the strawberry, is the theme for this motifstyled sampler. The fruit's recognizable shape is such a fun motif to interpret in various counted thread techniques. Chosen are queens, halfqueens, colonial knots, back stitches, and cross stitches. Although diminutive in size, it packs a challenge for an experienced embroiderer. Two pulled thread stitches are also used and, of course, the color red predominates.



Kit Contents:

36-count cream colored linen; 7 skeins of DMC threads; #24 and #26 tapestry needles; Charting; Stitch diagrams; Photo; Instruction manual; Washing instructions; 2-page bibliography of sampler making and history



Students will also need:

4"-5" hoop or other holding device, if desired; Scissors; Pencil; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification

* students must know some olde sampler stitches, be capable of following stitch diagrams, and have had experience working on linen fabric



Santa Gnome

Kurdy Biggs

Add a touch of whimsy to the Christmas season with this delightful Santa Gnome ornament. Santa Gnome is stitched with a mix of textures that include Rainbow Gallery's Elegance, Glisten, Petite Frost Rays, and Sparkle! Braid, along with Soie Perlee silk and Kreinik metallics. Using an array of Jessicas, Crescents, Sprats Heads, and Rhodes stitches, Santa Gnome will take shape on the canvas. Once the stitching is completed a selection of twinkling crystals and beads will be added to make sure that Santa Gnome sparkles on your Christmas tree.



Kit Contents:

8"x10" 18-count brown canvas; Rainbow Gallery's Elegance, Glisten, Petite Frosty Rays, and Sparkle! Braid; Soie perlee; Beads; 4mm crystals; Needles; Instructions



Students will also need:

8"x10" stretcher bars and tacks or staples to attach the canvas to the stretcher bars; Frame stand or weight; Laying tool; Highlighter; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Cocktail Begonia

Diane Clark

Enjoy creating the delicate beauty of this Cocktail Begonia and learn the basics of stumpwork and surface embroidery stitches. Spring green dupioni silk fabric adds brightness to this garden beauty. Using solid and variegated threads and wire, you will learn how to create each part of the flower using long and short, stem/outline, button hole, and whipped chain stitches. Wrapped wire completes the center of the flower. Suitable for anyone wanting to learn stumpwork.



Kit Contents:

8"x8" spring green dupioni silk; 8"x8" cotton muslin; 5"x5" cotton muslin; 2"x2" light weight interfacing; Gentle Arts Old Paint 705; Gentle Arts School House Red 7052; Weeks Dye Works Rust 1326; DMC 603 Light Medium Cranberry; DMC 604 Light Cranberry; DMC 605 Very Light Cranberry; DMC 726 Light Topaz; DMC Pearl Cotton #8 Yellow Green #3348; Anchor 844 Medium Fern Green; #10 embroidery needle; #18 and #22 chenille needle; Needle threader; 30-gauge cottonwrapped wire



Students will also need:

6" hoop (with stand for two-handed stitching preferred) or 8"x8" Evertite stretcher bars with tacks, T tool, and table clamps; 4" hoop; Thimble; Embroidery scissors; Measuring tape or ruler having both inches and centimeters/millimeters; Dull lead pencil; Fabric scissors, recommended; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Spring Flowers Pin Cushion and Scissors Fob Denise Harrington Pratt

This little needlework set is a celebration of spring. The focus of this class is finishing. While doing the pre-work of embroidering the components, students will use a variety of counted thread stitches, with alternative options. In class, construction will be the focus from the application of Fray-Stop, to making the cording, and putting it all together.



Kit Contents:

Instructions; 32-count linen; Variety of Anchor floss; Wood square; Wool felt; Matboard square; Button; Needles; Heavy duty template plastic; Masking tape; Cross-stitch finishing tape; Cording makers; Fray-Stop; Quick Grip trigger clamps; Wooden clamping boards

Students will also need:

Ruler; Aleene's Tacky Glue; Paint brush, flat ¼" or similar (a watercolor brush works well); An old dishtowel for wiping fingers; A binder and sheet protectors are helpful for organizing pages; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification

Lettering For Surface Embroidery

Are you frustrated when the name on your finished surface embroidery detracts from the stitching that surrounds it? This class will provide you with a method to use existing alphabets to personalize your finished surface pieces in a professional way. The finished sample might be used as a nametag or used in a quilt block.



Course length: 1 day Technique: Surface embroidery Proficiency: All levels Kit fee: \$60

Kit Contents:

Toile print ground fabric; Soie d'Alger silk thread; Tracing paper; Needles; Non-copyright alphabets; Instruction booklet

Students will also need:

4"-5" hoop; Glue stick; Ruler; Ultra-fine point black marker; Paper scissors; Light box with extension cord, optional (teacher will bring two); Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Raised Expectations Pendant

Kay Ackerman

A rigorous exercise in stitching not only on top of, but sideways and diagonally through extra-thick felt to create a three-dimensional beauty. The felt elevates the center Van Gogh glass tile which is surrounded by tiers of multi-hole Czech shaped beads: Telos, Arcos, and Chevrons. A neck strap and clasp made of tubular herringbone stitch result in a dramatic statement necklace. Three colorways to choose from.



Kit Contents:

Needles; Thread; Thick felt; Backing material; Stained-glass tile; Seed beads; Accent beads; Shaped beads

Students will also need:

Beading mat; Chain nose pliers; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Metals

*students should have experience in backstitching seed beads and tubular herringbone stitch




A Few of My Favorite Things Jane Ellen Balzuweit

Students will learn five pulled thread stitches along with the base for the Casalguidi embroidery, the Italian 3-sided stitch. Basic Casalguidi stitch with needle lace flowers and leaves become the center of attention. The different stitches are separated by a blackwork border in the color of the student's choice of Wildflower thread by Caron to make this lovely lacy sampler.

Course length: 2 days Technique: Casalguidi, Pulled thread, & Blackwork Proficiency: Basic/Intermediate Finished size: 7"x9" Kit fee: \$125

Kit Contents:

13"x15" 28-count cream Cashel linen; 7"x7" 18-count Dublin linen doodle cloth; DMC pearl cotton #5, #8, and #12 cream 712; 2 skeins, Wildflowers by Caron Collection (your choice of color); Rainbow Gallery Elegance silk pearl thread (if this thread is not available, substitution will be similar); 13"x15" and 7"x7" mini stretcher bars and tacks; #24 and #26 tapestry needles; Instruction booklet with pictures



Students will also need:

Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Little Red Strawberries Sampler and Tin Topper Eileen Bennett

Little Red Strawberries Sampler is a historic-style sampler featuring 25 bands and an abundance of strawberry motifs worked in the top random motif area. The strawberry motif is prominent throughout and all have been worked with a variety of period stitches which includes a cross, long arm cross, Belgian cross, diamond Rhodes, 4-way queens, diagonal rice, colonial knots, buttonhole bars, and knit stitch. The Tin Topper serves as a teaching aid or try-out for learning the 19 *olde sampler stitches*, and is mounted to a tin container to be used as a 'holder' for needlework tools. A fun project and a useful tool!



<u>Students will also</u> <u>need:</u>

4"-5" hoop; Scissors; Pencil; Your usual stitching supplies; Any desired lighting and magnification



Threads used will encompass a wide variety of textures and finishes to add depth and dimension to this distinctive piece. Wire lace fins and sea grass will also be added for additional visual interest. Such a stunning seahorse will need a variety of crystals and beads to assure that your finished piece will shimmer with life.






Chick and Chip Chat

An encounter between two dear wild things is the basis for this 2-day workshop in crewel embroidery. The fluffy chickadee is observing a clever chipmunk as he forages among the flowers and weeds. Realistic shading on the creatures will be taught the first day using Judy's painless method for soft shading. The second day the floral elements will be stitched using a very realistic approach. Some of the stitches will include bullion knots, Portuguese knotted stem, raised chain, and turkey work on such elements as pussy willow, clover, and mayflowers.



Gettysburg, PA: The Small Town with Lots to Do!

There's a lot going on in Gettysburg! Here is a partial list of the many things to do to help you have fun when you're not stitching! For more information on things to do in Gettysburg and the surrounding area, visit <u>https://destinationgettysburg.com/</u>

David Wills House – After the Battle of Gettysburg, David Wills invited President Abraham Lincoln to the Gettysburg National Cemetery's dedication. Lincoln stayed in and finished writing the Gettysburg Address in this house the night before delivering the speech at the dedication ceremony. <u>https://www.nps.gov/gett/planyourvisit/david-wills-house.htm</u>

Dobbin House – Built in 1776, Dobbin House is the oldest surviving house in Gettysburg. Currently housing two restaurants, a gift shop, and many rooms restored to the Colonial period, Dobbin House also offers daily guided tours. <u>http://www.dobbinhouse.com</u>

Eisenhower National Historic Site – Tour the weekend retreat and farm owned by President Dwight D. Eisenhower, where he would meet with world leaders in a less formal location away from the bustle of Washington, DC. <u>https://www.nps.gov/eise/index.htm</u>

Gettysburg National Military Park – Run by the National Parks Service, start at the Visitor Center and Museum to explore the events and issues leading up to the Civil War and to experience the famous Cyclorama with its enormous 360-degree painting and dramatic sound and lighting effects that create the sensation of being in the midst of the battle. Here you can also speak with a park ranger, get a park map, and meet up with licensed battlefield guides for tours by bus or car. You can also explore the park on your own, visit historic sites including Devil's Den and Little Round Top, and pay your respects at numerous monuments throughout the park. <u>https://www.nps.gov/gett/index.htm</u>.

Jennie Wade House – The home of the only civilian to be killed during the Battle of Gettysburg, the house holds daily tours. <u>https://www.gettysburgbattlefieldtours.com/jennie-wade-house/</u>

Seminary Ridge Museum – Along with numerous museum exhibits, tours are offered daily, including of the historic cupola where Union Brigadier General John Buford planned out his defensive lines on the soon-to-be battlefield. Thad's Place – Explore the life of Thaddeus Stevens, an influential Congressman during the Civil War, who was also an abolitionist involved with the Underground Railroad and a champion of public education and equal rights for all. A café is onsite. <u>https://www.thaddeusstevenssociety.com/</u>
